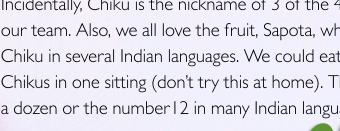

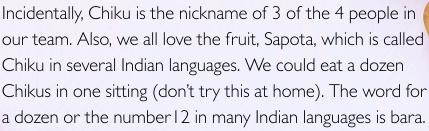

Try some fruit.



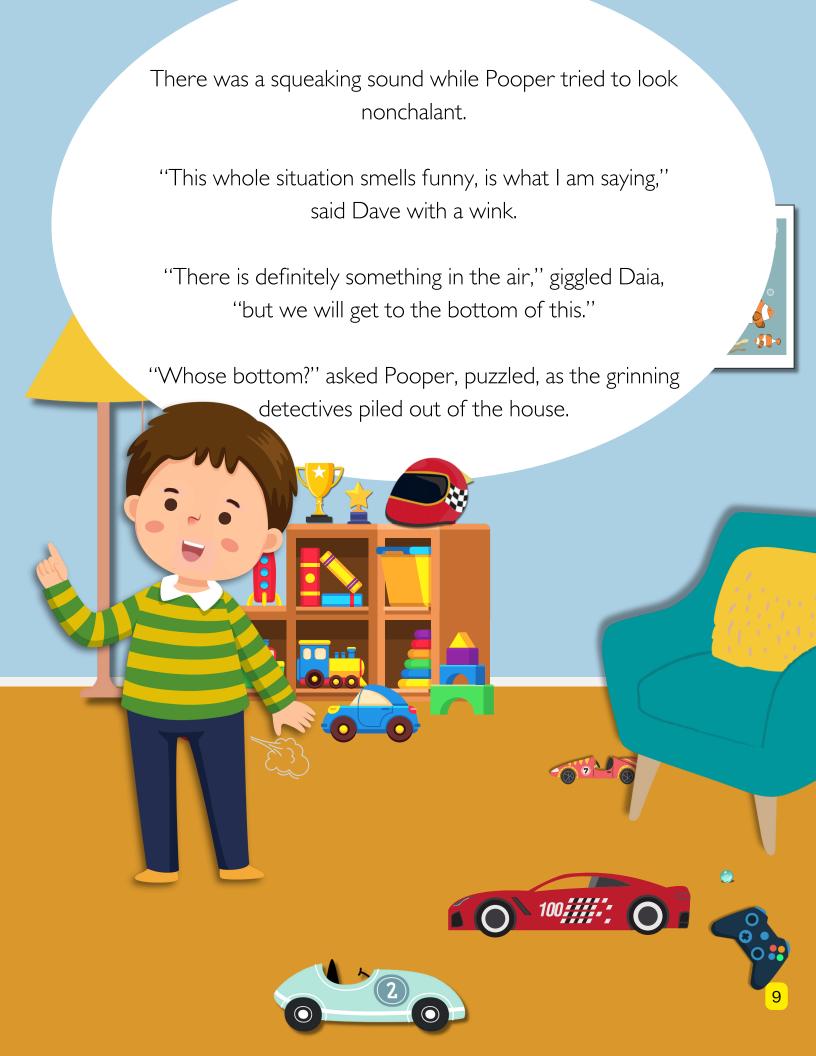


But grouchy Pooper wouldn't listen. 7 Pooper's worried parents decided they needed some expert help.

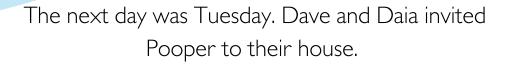




She whispered something in their ears. Their eyes grew wide as they understood what she was saying.

"I certainly wouldn't have thought of that."





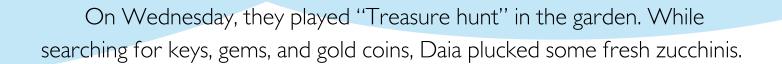

"We will even come by for any leftovers," grinned Dave at the surprised Pooper.

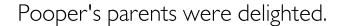

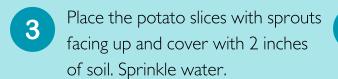

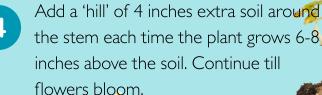


Take a sprouted potato and cut 2 -3 slices.

Hic..hic..what is hic..happening in your body?



#### What are hiccups?

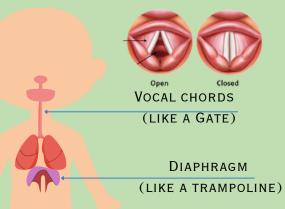
The strange hic.. hic.. sounds that come all of a sudden, which you cannot control, and which give a slight twitch in your chest are hiccups.

#### Who gets hiccups?

Everyone.. babies, children, adults, and even some animals get hiccups.

#### Inside your body without hiccups

Your body is like a fantastic house! Right under your lungs is a trampoline-like muscle called the diaphragm. At the top of the throat are the vocal cords which act like a gate.



When you breathe, this trampoline gently bounces down to pull air in and up to push air out. The vocal cords stay open to let the air flow freely.

### What happens during hiccups?

When you get a hiccup, your diaphragm (the trampoline) suddenly gives a quick, unexpected jump downwards! This makes air rush into your throat. But before that air can get far, your vocal cords (the gate) quickly snap shut! This makes the "hic!" sound.

In some cultures they say that you get hiccups when someone is fondly thinking of you!

### Hic..cup culprits

Hiccups occur when something irritates your diaphragm.

#### Why do they come?

Some of the common triggers for short term hiccups:



Eating / drinking too quickly or too much



Eating too spicy, too hot, or too cold



Excitement or nervousness



Swallowing a lot of air



Drinking a lot of soda

#### How to prevent them?

While there's no guaranteed way to prevent hiccups entirely, you can reduce your chances by avoiding common triggers:

- E
  - Eat slowly
- $\checkmark$ 
  - Avoid overeating
- V

Limit chewing gums and sodas

#### How to stop them?



Eat some sugar (you will love it)



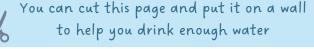
Sip some water (count five sips)
